## **Understanding Animal Behavior**

#### Temple Grandin, MS, PhD



Animals live in a sensory-based world, so it is important for an animal's first encounter with something to be a good experience to prevent the formation of fear memories. During her keynote address, renowned animal behaviorist and welfare advocate Dr. Temple Grandin will explore the importance of habituating an animal to all orientations of a new object, which

can help prevent a normally calm horse from acting up out of fear, whether at a show or elsewhere. She will also discuss the seven Jaak Panksepp emotional systems in animal brains as well as genetic effects on behavior.

Dr. Grandin is a Distinguished Professor of Animal Science at Colorado State University. Facilities she has designed for

handling livestock are used by many companies around the world. She has also been instrumental in implementing animal welfare auditing programs used by McDonald's, Wendy's, Whole Foods, and other corporations.

Dr. Grandin has appeared on numerous TV shows, and her books include *Thinking in Pictures*, *Livestock Handling and Transport, The Autistic Brain*, and the *New York Times* bestsellers *Animals in Translation* and *Visual Thinking*. Among her accolades, Dr. Grandin was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame in 2017 and the Colorado Authors' Hall of Fame in 2023, and she was named one of *USA Today*'s 2025 Women of the Year.

A Lifetime of Research: A Rider-Researcher's Journey in Biomechanics, Performance, and Rehabilitation

## Hilary M. Clayton, BVMS, PhD, DACVSMR, FRCVS



Understanding the interplay of ground reaction forces, conformation, and movement is indispensable for diagnosing and treating lameness, optimizing athletic performance, preventing injuries, and designing effective rehabilitation strategies.

During her lecture, renowned equine sports medicine and rehabilitation

expert Dr. Hilary Clayton will provide an evidence-based understanding of equine biomechanics that will enhance veterinarians' diagnostic, treatment, and rehabilitation protocols as well as advise on preventative measures related to conformation, training, and equipment.

For more than 40 years, Dr. Clayton has performed innovative research in the areas of locomotor biomechanics; lameness;

rehabilitation; conditioning programs for equine athletes; and the interaction between rider, tack, and horse. She has published seven books and over 250 peer-reviewed manuscripts. Dr. Clayton served as the Mary Anne McPhail Dressage Chair in Equine Sports Medicine at Michigan State University College of Veterinary Medicine from 1997 until she retired from academia in 2014.

Dr. Clayton is a charter diplomate and past president of the ACVSMR; an honorary fellow of the International Society for Equitation Science; and an inductee of the International Equine Veterinarians Hall of Fame and Midwest Dressage Association Hall of Fame, among others. She shows dressage horses up to the Grand Prix level and has earned U.S. Dressage Federation's gold, silver, and bronze medals.


